# MARKET REPORT

SUPPLY & QUALITY UPDATES

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## BROCCOLI AND CAULIFLOWER

These continue to be in bad shape with very limited supplies and very high pricing. Unseasonably early warm weather brought the fields forward resulting in supply gaps expecting to last through the end of this month. Conventional and Organic product is affected as is Value-Added Florets.

## BRUSSELS SPROUTS

High temps in the desert are causing quality issues leading to tighter grading of product which drops supply. We won't see significant relief until local crops start up around July in Castroville and Half Moon Bay.

## STRAWBERRIES

Supplies are expected to remain short as CA has been with several rain storms limiting harvest and affecting quality. The Oxnard and Santa Maria regions are producing less as well because of recent rains and early season high heat.

## ASPARAGUS

California supplies remain very snug and no signs of immediate improvement as we have more rain in the growing areas. Washington and Southern Baja are off to a slow start keeping prices up and supplies limited. Hoping to see improvement at the end of the month when these areas have increased production.

## ROUND, ROMA AND CHERRY TOMATOES

Round tomatoes continue to be short as the Culiacan crop came to a sudden halt and Florida does not have any significant volume. Romas are available but becoming a stronger market as consumers move to those with rounds being non-existent. Cherry Tomatoes are as short as round tomatoes. Grape tomatoes however are seeing better supplies and prices are coming down.
